JAMBOREE REGULATION "THE HERITAGE OF THE GREAT STEPPE"

1. General terms.

- 1.1. The format of the Jamboree is a field yurt and tent scout camp.
- 1.2. Location: Akmola region, Akkol district, Yernazar village (120 km from Nur-Sultan).
- 1.3. Dates: from 12 to 18 August 2019.
- 1.4. Day of arrival: August 12th. Departure day: August 18.
- 1.5. Official Opening of the Jamboree on 12 August, Closing Ceremony on 17 August.
- 1.6. Participants: 350 people from 10 countries between the ages of 11 and 29.
- 1.7. The purpose of the Jamboree is:
 - 1.7.1. introduction of the camp participants to the customs and traditions of the Kazakh people;
 - 1.7.2. strengthening partnerships with domestic and foreign youth organizations;
 - 1.7.3. development of domestic and incoming youth tourism;
 - 1.7.4. training of the younger generation in life skills.
- 1.8. The Jamboree is based on the following principles:
 - Following the Scout promise and the law;
 - Strict observance of the Declaration of Human Rights and the Convention on the Rights of the Child;
 - Safety for life and health of the Jamboree participants, respect for their personal dignity and character;
 - Combination of individual interests, personal development and self-fulfillment of the participants with the interests of the group, development of a sense of collectivity and teamwork;
 - Humane nature of relationships and educational programmes;
 - Individual approach to any Jamboree participant in case of disagreements and conflict, confidentiality in solving personal problems;
 - Unanimity in combination with children's and pedagogical self-governance.
- 1.9. The expenses for the Jamboree 2019 are covered by a grant from NAO Civic Initiatives Support Centre, raised funds (sponsorship and earmarked contributions, etc.).

2. Jamboree program.

- 2.1. The Jamboree Program is developed by the Organizing Committee.
- 2.2. The programme includes the following:
 - of the official opening and closing ceremonies of the Jamboree;
 - protocol activities;
 - presentation by participants of their National Scout Organizations (NSOs) and countries;
 - workshops.
- 2.3. Jamboree participants are given the opportunity to present their NSOs and countries in the following ways:
 - organization of a permanent exhibition;
 - conducting presentations.

- 2.4.** The program activities of the Jamboree shall be:
- to be safe for the participants;
 - be simple and accessible to all;
 - be carried out without damaging the environment.
- 2.5.** The Jamboree Program is published on the official website of Scouts of Kazakhstan - www.scouts.kz
- 2.6.** The main directions of the Jamboree are as following:
- organization of recreation and recovery of participants;
 - implementation of educational subprogrammes;
 - Creation of conditions for the development of communicative and leadership qualities of the participants, education of tolerant relations;
 - Creation of conditions for the realization of diverse interests of participants in the sphere of leisure, recreation, sports and collective creative activity;
 - Formation of the basics of applied tourism skills and abilities, self-service skills, life support and hostel skills in the natural environment;
 - to organise an active scouting practice;
 - Practical training of Scout instructors for the year-round Scout programme.

3. Organization of the Jamboree.

3.1. The Jamboree is held in the real-life conditions in Akmola region, Akkol district, Yernazar village (120 km from Nur-Sultan).

3.2. Accommodation for participants is organized in tents and yurts equipped with sleeping bags and carriages.

3.3. Participants are provided with meals, which are brought in - catering - in compliance with all necessary sanitary and epidemiological requirements and standards. Eating is allowed only after washing or special treatment of hands with disinfectants.

3.4. The territory of the Jamboree shall be equipped with everything necessary for the implementation of the educational Program.

3.5. Medical care at the Jamboree is provided by qualified medical personnel on a 24-hour basis. Operative medical care is provided by medical staff in the reception area of the medical tent. The camp is equipped with a first-aid kit in accordance with the regulations. Transportation of patients is organized with the help of a car on duty. Health workers have a personal mobile phone.

3.6. Child protection and law enforcement at the Jamboree are provided by a specialized security service. Night-time patrols of the Jamboree are conducted. If necessary, instructors and service personnel of the Jamboree may be engaged for night duty. The Jamboree guard has personal walkie-talkies and telephones to communicate with each other and the headquarters.

3.7. The transportation of participants from Nur-Sultan to the Jamboree and back is carried out by comfortable buses in an organized form. When boarding the bus, the participants will be provided with a mandatory visual medical examination.

3.8. The main work is carried out in Taipa (groups), as a rule, of different age, numbering up to 32 people. Each Taipa is headed by two Sardars (Scouts Instructors) from among the most prepared members of the NSO "Scouts of the Great Steppe".

3.9. Taipa's activities are carried out in small groups - Tops.

3.10. In Taipa and Tops, self-governing bodies are formed: Tore and Bas Tore. Other duties are distributed among the participants, the order of appointment of duty officers is determined, etc.

3.11. The Program and Methodological Center of the Jamboree is the Headquarters: program manager, heads of subprograms, presenter, photo and video operator, sound engineer.

3.12. The Jamboree should be quiet after the lights out. All competitors should be present at their camp after 00.00 hours or have the permission of their supervisor. The Jamboree Security Service has the right to detain competitors who break the rules of the Jamboree and fail to observe the silence.

4. Managing the Jamboree.

4.1. The Jamboree shall be managed by the Director of the Jamboree, who shall be responsible for the state of the work, the safety of the Jamboree property, and the life and health of the Jamboree participants.

4.2. Employees may be engaged to work at the Jamboree, both on a paid basis in accordance with the agreement on providing compensatory services, and volunteers on a voluntary basis.

4.3. Each Jamboree staff member shall present a personal medical card with a statement of health status and access to work, as well as other necessary documents, when hiring. Employees shall be obliged to familiarize themselves with these Regulations and job descriptions.

4.4. Taipa's Sardars are responsible for the life and health of members of the Taipa, their welfare and leisure activities.

4.5. The Sardars of the Taipa live in a separate tent in the Taipa area. The other staff reside in the designated area of the Jamboree, based on safety requirements. Accommodation in the Jamboree by unauthorized persons is not permitted.

4.6. Before starting the work of the Jamboree, during the preparatory and setting periods, the Director of the Jamboree shall organize, with the participation of the Programme Manager, medical staff, Sardarov, volunteers and other production meetings, briefings, workshops within the scope of his competence on the organization of the Jamboree, nutrition, sports and public events, safety precautions, injury prevention, accident prevention, observance of sanitary and fire safety rules, observance of the daily routine, how to conduct hiking and competitions.

4.7. The Director of the Jamboree shall conduct daily staff meetings with Sardars and other staff as necessary for the operational organization of the work.

4.8. Smoking tobacco and other smoking mixtures, drinking alcohol and alcoholic beverages, and using drugs and other prohibited substances are strictly prohibited in the Jamboree.

4.9. Staff members of the Jamboree shall not leave the workplace or leave the Jamboree without the permission of the Director of the Jamboree.

5. Languages.

5.1. The official languages of the Jamboree are Kazakh, Russian and English.

5.2. All information about the Jamboree is distributed by its Organizing Committee in these languages.

5.3. The operational manual serving the staff of the Jamboree must be known in one of the official languages of the Jamboree.

6. Trading operations.

6.1. On the territory of the Jamboree camp it is allowed to sell only literature, information materials about Scouting, about Kazakhstan and Scout souvenirs.

6.2. Trading operations on the territory of the Jamboree may be carried out only in specially designated places.

6.3. Sale of alcohol and tobacco products is prohibited in the Jamboree. Participants and guests are responsible for distribution of alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, drugs or toxic substances in accordance with the legislation of the Republic of Kazakhstan.

6.4. The Jamboree Administration has the right to request an immediate examination at the Jamboree Medical Station for alcoholic, toxic or drug intoxication. Refusal to pass the examination is considered to be an admission of a violation.

7. Safety.

7.1. Before the start of the Jamboree, each participant shall be instructed by the head of the delegation on the rules of conduct and safety (on being in the forest, handling the fire, using tools, etc.), as well as sanitary and hygienic rules. Additional special instructions are given to the group before the event.

7.2. It is prohibited to stay in the Jamboree without special registration. When registering, the person informs the purpose of the visit to the Jamboree, the expected time and place of stay. He

or she shall be issued a Guest of the Jamboree 2019 badge and his or her details shall be recorded. A person who is in the Jamboree without a participant's necktie or guest badge should be reported to the Jamboree Security Service as a matter of urgency.

7.3. It is prohibited to leave the territory of the Jamboree without the approval of the administrative center. Sardar must know where his/her Taipa members. If a member of the Jamboree does not return at the agreed time, Sardar immediately notifies the management of the Jamboree.

7.4. The territory of the Jamboree is prohibited:

- smoking in and around the camp and Jamboree events;
- drinking alcoholic beverages (including low-alcohol beverages);
- Use of substances with toxic or narcotic effects.

7.5. For smokers (persons over 18 years of age), a special smoking area, allocated outside the Jamboree, equipped in accordance with the rules of fire safety.

7.6. Saws, axes should be stored in specially designated places. Work at the fire is allowed only with long trousers and closed shoes. Fire mittens must be worn.

7.7. Only permitted in designated and marked places:

- collection of drinking water;
- Washing and brushing of teeth;
- Bathing;
- use of the toilet

8. Attribute of the participant.

8.1. Each participant in the Jamboree shall be provided with a chevron bearing the Jamboree logo, the presence of which confirms his or her involvement in the Jamboree. The chevron is a pass on the Jamboree and must be sewn on a Scout's uniform shirt.

9. Medicine.

9.1. Each member of the Jamboree must undergo a medical examination before traveling and receive a medical certificate, which must be submitted to the head of the delegation.

9.2. During the Jamboree, the competitor must immediately inform Sardar of any health problems or injuries that may arise. If Sardar is not available, the competitor may contact any adult member of the Jamboree or directly to the medical station. Sardar should take the child to the clinic when there is a risk of injury or any illness.

9.3. A participant with special health problems should have the necessary medication with him/her.

9.4. It is not allowed to stay in the sun without headgear.

10. Prohibited.

10.1. Consumption of unboiled water for drinking; consumption of unwashed fruits and vegetables; storage and use of perishable products.

It is strictly forbidden to cut down any trees and bushes, cut off green branches. It is allowed to collect deadwood and fallen trees. If a living growing tree is used in the building, the structure is fastened only with the help of ropes. It is strictly forbidden to drive nails into living trees or otherwise damage them.

11. Responsibility.

11.1. Violation of the rules of stay at the Jamboree may result in fines for participants and guests. In case of systematic violation (2 times or more) guests and participants are obliged to leave the territory of the Jamboree.
